After tuning into our Squid Dissection program, make this fun Squid Headband to put your knowledge to the test! See if you can identify the following squid parts;

- Mantle
- Fin
- Arm
- Tentacle
- Sucker
- Eye
- Siphon



Materials

- Construction paper (any colour)
- Black, white and pink craft paper
- Scissors
- Glue, tape or stapler
- Cheerios or beads

Steps

1 – Cut two long strips of construction paper, and staple them together to make one long strip. This piece will act as the headband.

2 – Cut a half oval out of construction paper, and glue to the middle of your long strip.

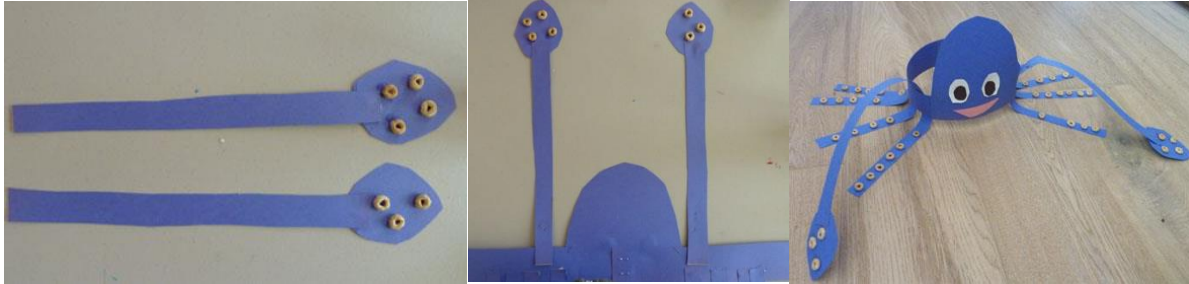


3 – Cut out 8 strips of paper that will act as squid arms, and glue or staple to the back of the headband. Glue cheerios or bead to the front to act as suckers.

4 – For the tentacles, cut two long strips and then glue two oval shapes to the end of the strip. Glue or staple to the top side of the headband on the inside.

5 – Add eyes and a mouth to the headband using black, white and pink craft paper. Bonus points if you cut out a small rectangle and attach to your headband to act as a siphon.

6 – Fit the headband around your head, and staple together to hold in place.
